

Vocational Training & Youth Enterprise Start-ups (2024)

1. Project Overview

- **Objective:** Provide youth with vocational skills and support for enterprise creation to improve livelihoods and reduce unemployment.
- Location: Lusaka Province, Zambia.
- **Timeline:** February November 2024.

2. Background & Rationale

- **Context:** Youth unemployment remains high in Zambia, especially in peri-urban areas where access to vocational training and start-up capital is limited.
- Rationale: Equipping youth with practical skills in carpentry, tailoring, and agribusiness, combined with mentorship and start-up support, empowers them to create microenterprises and sustainable income sources.

3. Activity Components

a) Vocational Training

- 60 youth trained in carpentry, tailoring, and small-scale agribusiness.
- 6-month structured training program in partnership with TEVETA-accredited trainers.

b) Start-up Support

- 15 start-up kits distributed (sewing machines, carpentry toolsets, agri-input starter packs).
- Business planning and financial literacy workshops.

c) Mentorship & Market Linkages

- Youth connected to local mentors and cooperative unions.
- Exposure visits to existing enterprises.

4. Detailed Execution Phases

Phase 1: Recruitment & Training (Feb-Jun 2024)

- Mobilized and selected 60 youth (50% female).
- Conducted intensive vocational and entrepreneurship training.

Phase 2: Enterprise Establishment (Jul-Sep 2024)

- Distributed start-up kits to selected graduates.
- Provided technical and business coaching. Phase 3: Mentorship & Market Linkages (Sep-Oct 2024)





- Linked graduates to mentors and cooperative unions.
- Facilitated local exhibitions and business fairs.

Phase 4: Review & Reporting (Nov 2024)

- Conducted follow-up surveys to assess enterprise progress.
- Compiled implementation report and photo documentation.

5. Implementation Timeline

Phase	Timeframe	Key Activities
Recruitment & Training	Feb–Jun 2024	60 youth trained in vocational skills
Enterprise Support	Jul-Sep 2024	15 start-up kits distributed
Mentorship	Sep-Oct 2024	Mentorship sessions & market linkages
Review	Nov 2024	Follow-up surveys & reporting

6. Outcomes & Impact

- **Reach:** 60 youth trained; 15 supported with start-up kits.
- Enterprises Established: 25 microenterprises operational within 6 months.
- **Employment:** 40 youth reporting income generation by project close.
- **Skills Transfer:** Increased youth capacity in financial literacy and entrepreneurship.
